The Weather

Overland Park, Kansas, June temperatures range from highs in the mid to high 80s F (mid 20s to low 30s C) to lows in the mid 60s F (mid teens C).





Overland Park Convention Center has been named the Best Small Convention Center in North America.

Ample Free Parking

There are approximately 1,000 convention center parking spaces. Over 200 of those spaces are located in a covered garage. All hotels have free and ample parking.

Accessibility

Covered handicap parking is located near entrances and an elevator provides easy access to both floors of the convention center.
